You are invited to attend the Houghton ROTC Commissioning Service to be held in the Recital Hall [CFA] at 3:30pm on Friday, May 11th. Houghton senior Jessica Austin will be commissioned as a US Army Second Lieutenant, with a specialization in Medical Services. Ceremony participants include Junior cadet Cydney Blong [introductory remarks], Julian Cook and Jern-Yi Chong [anthem], Dean John Brittain [invocation], Col. Michael Bianchi [recognition], President Shirley Mullen [remarks], and Rev. Kevin Austin [blessing the bars and benediction]. There will also be a special Silver Dollar Salute immediately following the ceremony in front of the CFA.

Jessica Austin graduates on May 12th with a major in history and a minor in military leadership. She will begin her military service as a Reserve Duty Medical Services Officer. In the summer of 2011 she successfully completed three weeks of US Army Airborne School at Ft. Benning, Georgia with four jumps from a C-17 and 1 jump from a C-130 at 1300 feet. She also completed the four-week Leadership Development and Assessment course this past summer at Fort Lewis, Washington. Upon commissioning, 2LT Austin will begin training at Fort Sam Houston, Texas on August 28th to become a medical services officer.

ALSO: Any class that is dropped during the first two weeks of classes will be removed from the student's record, *BUT* after the first two weeks, leaving a class is "withdrawing" and will result in a grade of 'W' which will show up on the student's transcript and counts toward attempted hours.

INDEPENDENT STUDIES: Forms should be in the Academic Records office by the end of the first week of the semester.

MAJOR DECLARATION: Students with more than 45 credits accumulated are expected to declare a major. Forms can be found at the Academic Records office.
